### Who is this course for?

SEN Provision (Post 16) - The Pathway to Independence course provides students with the opportunity to access a fun and varied curriculum, tailored to meet their individual needs. The course aims to develop core communication, confidence and independence skills so that students can progress to the next step towards adult life.

Pathway to Independence allow learners to develop the skills most relevant to them, as they prepare for or make the most of adult life. They are able to combine employability, personal and social and learning skills, as appropriate, to create a highly personalised package to meet their individual needs, whether their primary focus is on progression to employment, independent living, further learning or a combination of these.

### What will I gain from this course?

Promoting Independence programme is for learners to develop the skills and confidence necessary to lead as full and independent a life as possible. The programme offers a safe and nurturing environment which enables learners to build confidence and self-esteem and feel empowered to take an active role in planning for their future. Learners will enjoy a varied curriculum which comprises of a mix of off-site, practical and classroom-based activities. Learners will develop their independence and social skills, can form meaningful friendships within their peer group and develop a sense of belonging within the wider community.

## Progression and Careers:

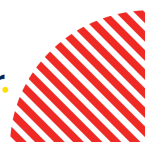
