Who is this course for?

Pre-Internships are college-based programmes for young adults aged 16-25 who have an Education Health Care Plan (EHCP). Our aim is to prepare pre-interns to develop self-confidence, as well as specific social and work-related skills, so they can be confident to take decisions regarding their next steps.

What will I gain from this course?

Pre-Internships are for students who are not quite ready to go into the workplace. After one year, Pre-Interns may progress to a 1-Year Supported Internship which will include time spent in the workplace. Students are also expected to study English and maths alongside.

What will I study?

Pre-Internships are structured study programmes set in the campus premises. The pre-internship equips students with learning difficulties or disabilities to gain skills they need to progress onto a full Supported Internship and time spent in the workplace. They also include English and maths study and a chance to gain qualifications where appropriate.

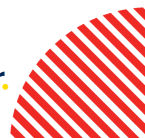
How will I study?

The course will be delivered in a classroom setting and will include an element of work-related activities to support skills development. A more hands-on way of learning will give you practical skills and knowledge and will be carefully balanced with health and safety requirements.

You will work in a learning environment designed to help you reach your true potential with excellent pastoral and academic support from our dedicated staff, who have a wealth of experience as well as links to local industry and enrichment trips to build confidence and team skills.



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What are the entry requirements?

You don't need to have any specific prior learning to take this qualification. You will need to complete an assessment in Essential Skills, English and maths.

Learners on this programme must work towards and be able to travel independently by the end of the academic year.

How will I be assessed?

This will consist of a portfolio of evidence which demonstrates achievement of 100% of the learning outcomes associated with each unit.

The evidence could include:

- Worksheets
- Practical work
- Assignments
- Assessor observation
- Candidates proof of work

Progression and Careers:

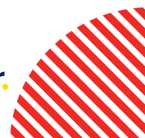
